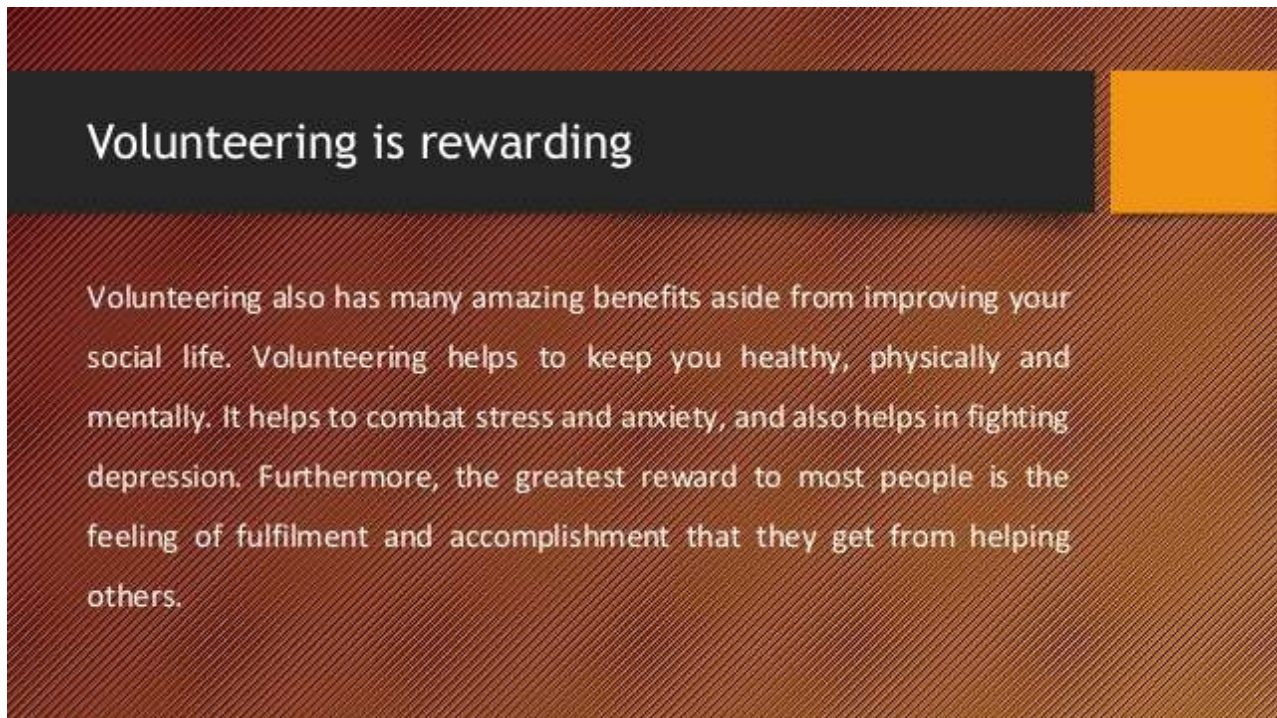

Treasurer's Report 2022/23

The club's financial statements for the year ending 28th February 2023 are attached.

As of 28th February 2023, the club had net funds of \$95,220.79 which is \$16,157.31 more than last year and includes \$55,000 which is allotted to the building fund.

As usual, the total assets represents cash funds and does not take into account the other assets owned by the club including equipment, uniform inventory, and team kits and other physical assets such as the BBQ, signage, maintenance gear etc which are not recorded on the balance sheet, as they have been expensed on acquisition.

Some highlights of the year are:

1. The canteen (including the Bunnings BBQ) had a fantastic year, helped by the dry weather, plenty of games, and the relocation of games from Aquatic. Thank you to the Gunnings who managed the canteen so well, and to all the Bunnings BBQ volunteers.
2. We purchased two new zooka machines plus a second hand one from the Greer family (former club members) at a heavily discounted price.
3. Registration fees were only down because wet weather over winter 2022 meant that three Minor League (adult) teams were unable to play. Junior numbers are up on 2022.
4. Uniform costs were down. That is partly because uniform purchases are cyclical as our stock levels change, but also because stocks have been rundown as the committee explores new ways of sourcing uniforms (rather than holding stock ourselves)
5. Medals and Trophies were lower. This reflects a timing difference as trophies for both 2021 and 2022 cost were included in the 2022 financial statements.

I would like to thank our sponsors Chubbs, Display Solutions, Balgowlah RSL, Bendigo Bank Freshwater, Artifex Interiors, All Sports Apparel, and our new sponsor at Tyrepower Brookvale. This support is much appreciated, and hopefully club members are able to reciprocate when there is an opportunity.

I would also like to thank my fellow Committee members, and all the parents who have helped their team or the club in some capacity during the year. As you may be aware there are a number of volunteer positions to be filled, so please consider nominating for one of those. Many hands does make for light work.

On that note, this is my final year as Treasurer of this great club. My son is in his final season of junior baseball. While he is likely to continue to play in the adult league, after 8 years this is an appropriate time to pass on the role to a new guard. I have had the pleasure of working with a great group of people on the Committee over that time, and most of the time it hasn't felt like hard work. I would like to mention in particular our outgoing Acting President, David Gledhill, who has been a constant throughout my time as Treasurer, and who has worked tirelessly and has really been the heart and soul of the Club.

I hope everyone had a great season and wish the club and members every success in the future.

Best All-Rounder, Players Player

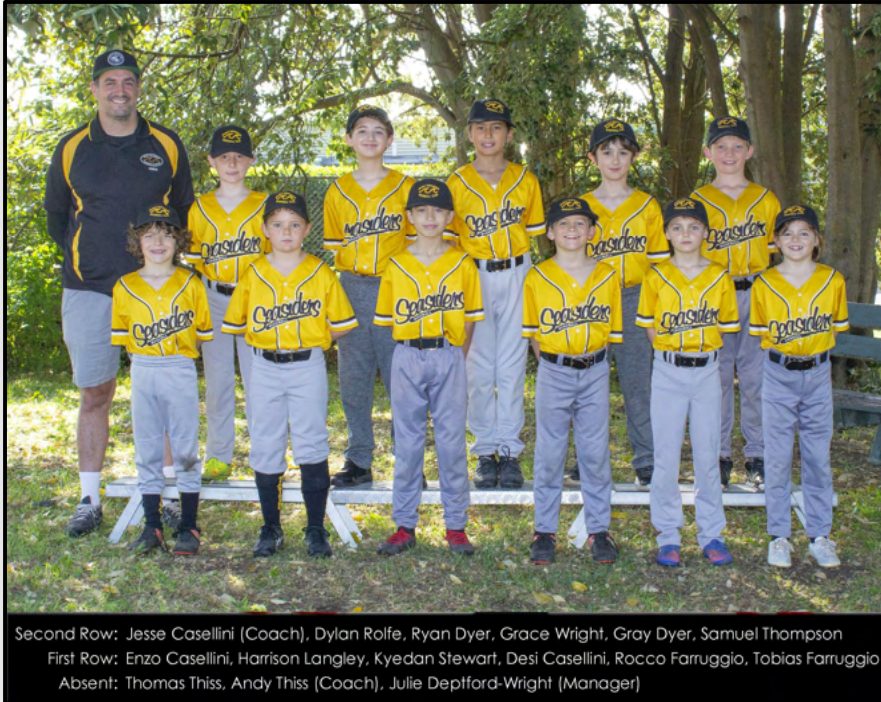
